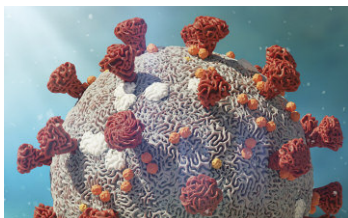

Library Shutdown Due to COVID-19 Pandemic

On Friday, March 13 as this newsletter was going to press, the Library was ordered to close to the public by First Selectman Steve Mattson to help slow the spread of the COVID-19 Virus. His order lasts until April 30, but depending on the situation at that time, the shutdown could last longer. As of this writing, staff will be reporting to work and will assist patrons via phone and email. We will also investigate the safety of offering curbside or delivery services. Our digital resources are available 24/7. We can assist you over the phone if you need help accessing them. If your Lyme Library card is expired, we can renew it over the phone for you. Your card must be up to date to access our digital offerings. If you do not have a library card, we can give you a temporary card via email that you can use. Once the shutdown is over, you will have to come to the library and confirm your identity to continue using the card.



If you do not subscribe to our email list or follow us on social media, this would be a good time to start. We will be posting daily updates about available services. Open Studio Art Show: June 30 through July 28

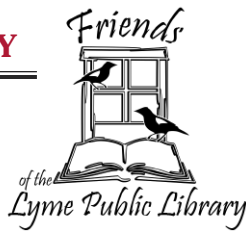

May 9: Dot Orr Cookbook Collection. Pick a recipe from one of the many volumes in the Dot Orr Collection at the Library.

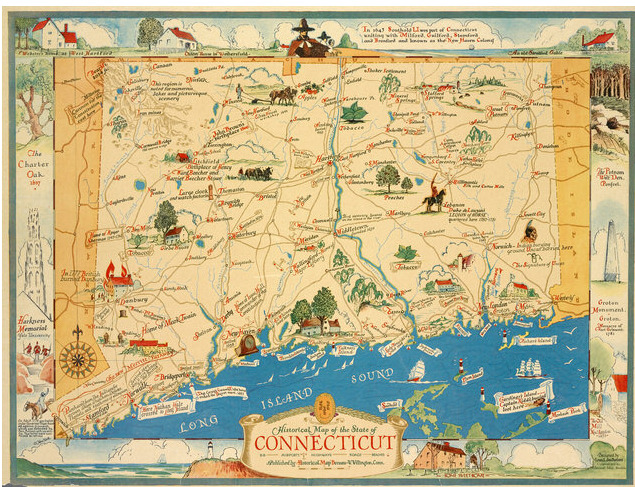
