A wide selection of materials is available via interlibrary loan at any of the libraries in the LION consortium (Old Lyme, Essex, East Lyme, Old Saybrook, etc.). Access to those materials will soon be available to Lyme



residents. Just enter your request online or have a Lyme staff member help you at the Circulation desk. Usually within a week, you will receive

notice that the item you have requested is ready for pick-up at the Lyme Library.

If you attend one of our exciting programs, clubs or children's activities, your books can be ready for you to take home after the event. New books, and other materials are being added to the collection all the time.
